Good Hart Artist Residency awarded mission support grant from the State of Michigan Arts and Culture Council

Good Hart Artist Residency has been awarded a mission support grant of \$22,500 from the State of Michigan Arts and Culture Council (MACC). The grant was awarded through the MACC peer review process and was one of 828 applications to compete for MACC fiscal year 2025 funding.

The grant includes \$17,500 in operational support and \$5,000 for arts education which will be used to help cover the costs of the Residency’s programming in local schools,

including; Harbor Springs Public Schools, Petoskey Public Schools, Pellston Public Schools, Mackinac Island Public School, Lakeview High School and Crooked Tree High School.

“We are extremely grateful for the Michigan Arts and Culture Council’s grant to support our programming that brings artists from around the world to this area and connects them with the community for arts events,” said Sue Klco, Executive Director.

Organizations receiving a

MACC grant are required to match those funds with other public and private dollars to meet the requirements of each category, which totaled \$5,265 for the Good Hart Artist Residency.

“We are appreciative of the continued strong community support for the program. Local donations and volunteers have allowed us to impact the lives of over 100 artists and thousands of community members over the last eleven years.” Klco said.

The MACC peer review

process allows for each grant application to be competitively considered by a panel of in-state and out-of-state arts and culture professionals. This ensures the taxpayers, who support this project through legislative appropriations, and all other visitors or residents in Michigan will have access to the highest quality arts and cultural Experiences.
